This course introduces basic statistical concepts including mean, standard deviation, frequency, probability, binomial distribution, normal curve, sample means, confidence limits, hypothesis testing, and linear regression. Statistical analysis will be done using computer software.

- Master's degree from a regionally accredited university with a minimum of 18 graduate credits in the discipline
- Three years teaching experience, preferably post-secondary
- Commitment to community college philosophy
- Understanding of and experience with technology as a learning tool, both within and outside the classroom
