

## SOCIAL SCIENCES INSTRUCTOR

## **FULL-TIME POSITION**

This will be a position in the department of social sciences with an emphasis on history, political science and/or sociology, using the approved course outcome guidelines, and leading assessment of student performance in these courses. At least one section of the courses must be taught at night each semester, and the instructor should expect to travel to one of the college's extension sites to teach dual-enrolled students when necessary.

The instructor will be required to update curriculum, articulate changes, report student results, and serve on assigned college committees. The instructor is expected to remain current in the field through attendance at professional development activities and campus meetings.

The instructor will also be responsible for supporting adjunct faculty within the department.

## **QUALIFICATIONS**

- 1. Master's degree (Ph.D. preferred) with at least 18 graduate credit hours in college level history, political science and/or sociology. Successful candidate with 18 graduate credit hours in one of the disciplines will be expected to earn 18 graduate credit hours in a second discipline prior to tenure.
- 2. Three years of community college teaching preferred.
- 3. Evidence of strong oral and written communication skills.
- 4. Experience with technology as a learning tool, both within and outside the classroom.
- 5. Familiarity with current issues and research in Math/Statistics instruction.
- 6. Demonstrated ability to work collegially and collaboratively throughout the workplace.
- 7. Commitment to community college philosophy required.
- 8. Other duties as assigned.
