Summer is also a great time to:

- Catch up - We recommend students complete 30 credits every year to complete your degree in two years. This means if you have not finished 30 credits for the year, you should take the balance in the summer.
- Get ahead – Take classes in the summer to get ahead in your coursework and graduate sooner.
- Enjoy a fast-paced semester – With accelerated classes you can quickly complete classes in a shorter time.
- LOTS of summer scholarships are available – MCC has summer scholarships available for all students, including those who are dual enrolled through their high school.

Montcalm Community College is undergoing a lot of physical changes. Renovation of the Kenneth J. Smith Building on our Sidney campus will be finished in June, and will house math, science, nursing, and other health career classes. In addition, students now have a “one-stop” center on our Sidney campus to handle any of their questions or concerns, and our MCC Express program continues to grow, providing one-on-one student support.

Steps to Register / Additional Information

Step 1: Apply online

Complete MCC's online application for admission at montcalm.edu/apply-now.

Step 2: Send transcripts

Arrange for official copies of your final high school/GED transcripts and college transcripts (if applicable) to be sent to the MCC Student Services Department at studentservices@montcalm.edu.

Step 3: Complete Financial Aid

Students are encouraged to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at studentaid.gov. Grants, loans, or work study positions may be available to those who qualify. MCC's school code is 002295. View all MCC scholarship opportunities at montcalm.edu/scholarships.

Step 4: Complete new student orientation online

Orientation is optional and offered online and in-person. For orientation dates and more information, visit montcalm.edu/orientation.

Step 5: Placement testing

A placement assessment is needed in reading, writing and math. The assessment takes about 1½ hours to complete. To schedule an online or in-person assessment or for more information email studentsuccess@montcalm.edu or call **989-328-1264**.

Step 6: Technology

Students must activate their MCC student account prior to registration. Go to montcalm.edu/login and follow the "First Time Password Request" process.

Once you have a password, access your account at login.montcalm.edu.

Step 7: Register

You may register for your classes online at my.montcalm.edu under the Academics tab. You may also make an appointment to meet with a counselor/advisor for assistance with registration by contacting MCC's Student Success Center at studentsuccess@montcalm.edu or calling **989-328-1264**.

Step 8: Pay for classes

Pay or arrange for payment of tuition and fees. For more information about financial aid options, see the Financial Aid section on pages 21-22.


F2F	Live instruction where the instructor and students meet in a traditional classroom setting during a regularly scheduled course time.

Campus Maps



Scholarships

MCC Summer Camp Scholarships Available

MCC Summer Camp Scholarships provide limited funds to support families experiencing financial hardship that want to attend an MCC Summer Camp. Eligible families must reside in one of the seven Montcalm public school districts or in the Belding Area Schools district. The scholarship pays up to 50% of up to three camps per child per year, and there is no limit on the number of children per family. The scholarship application should be completed and approved before registering for camp(s). The online form can be found at montcalm.edu/camps. Funds are provided by the Montcalm Community College Foundation's Stanley and Blanche Ash Educational Fund.

Applications open March 28, 2022.

General Information

Transfer and Articulation

Students can start at Montcalm Community College, complete general education requirements at a fraction of the cost of attending a university or private college, and still go just about anywhere from here to continue their education.

MCC offers 58 associate degree, certificate and job training programs. The highest degree offered by MCC is the associate degree. Any degree completed at MCC can serve as the starting point for a bachelor's degree, although transfer credits may differ based on program, type of classes and transfer school and major.

MCC participates with the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), which allows students to complete general education requirements at one college or university, then transfer those courses to meet general education requirements at another college or university, without any special exceptions.

Articulation agreements also provide options for seamless transfer into a variety of advanced-degree programs at other institutions.

Academic advising is available to help students determine their program options, course selections and transferability. An appointment may be made by contacting MCC's Student Success Center at studentsuccess@montcalm.edu or call **989-328-1264**.

General Information

Academic Advising

Students are encouraged to meet with a counselor or academic advisor prior to registering. For an appointment, contact MCC's Student Success Center by emailing studentsuccess@montcalm.edu or calling **989-328-1264**. Transcripts from high school and any colleges attended should be on file at MCC as well as assessment testing results before meeting with an academic counselor or advisor.

Assessment

Academic assessment is required for all students pursuing a program of study at MCC or who wish to enroll in a course with a placement prerequisite. MCC offers Guided Self-Placement where students after completing an ACCUPLACER assessment or submitting previously taken ACCUPLACER, ACT and SAT test scores from within the past five years meet with a counselor/advisor for placement into appropriate courses. New students must complete and submit an Application for Admission prior to completing ACCUPLACER assessment or meeting with a counselor/advisor for Guided Self Placement. Students exempt from testing are those who have previously completed the ACCUPLACER assessment, have earned an associate or bachelor's degree, are age 60 or older, audit classes, or obtain a waiver from the instructor.

Auditing a Course

Those wishing to audit a course must complete and submit a Course Audit Form, available in Student Services or from my.montcalm.edu under the forms link on the Academics tab. Audit status must be indicated at the time of registration. Students do not receive credit or a grade for audited courses and are not eligible for financial aid or veterans benefits. Completed audit forms can be turned in at registration or faxed to the attention of Enrollment Services at 989-328-1203 or emailed to studentservices@montcalm.edu (please include Course Audit in the subject line).

Corequisites and Prerequisites

A prerequisite is a requirement that must be successfully completed prior to enrollment in another course. A corequisite is a requirement that must be completed before or at the same time as another course. All exceptions require written departmental approval.

Tuition & Fees

Please visit montcalm.edu/tuition for current tuition and fee information. Tuition and fees are subject to approval of the MCC Board of Trustees.

Residency

Residents of the MCC district have lived in the Carson City-Crystal, Central Montcalm, Greenville, Lakeview, Montabella, Tri County or Vestaburg public school district for at least six consecutive months prior to the last day of registration for the term for which the student is enrolled. Students are required to furnish proof of residency such as a driver's license or tax receipts.

Refund Policy

Tuition and fees are 100 percent refundable during the enrollment and drop period. No refunds of tuition or fees will be made for withdrawals after the end of the enrollment period. Non-attendance or failure to officially drop classes during the drop period does not cancel the student's responsibility to pay for classes.

Federal Refund Policy for Students Receiving Title IV Aid

Students who receive any form of Federal Title IV Student Financial Aid and withdraw from classes before completing 60 percent of the semester may be required to repay a prorated portion of the federal aid they received.

Payment of Tuition and Fees

Payment for all registration is due by the designated due date for each semester. Due dates are noted in the Academic Calendar on page 30. After the specified date, payment is due at the time of registration.

Payment Options

Tuition and fee payments may be made:

1. **Online at my.montcalm.edu** on the Finances tab, using a credit/debit card (MasterCard, Visa or Discover) or a checking account.
2. **By mail**, using check or money order. Please include the student's name and MCC ID number on the check. Payments should be mailed to: Montcalm Community College, 2800 College Drive, Sidney, MI 48885.
3. **In-person** in the Donald C. Burns Administration/Library Building on MCC's Sidney campus at 2800 College Drive, or in the Stanley and Blanche Ash Technology and Learning Center on MCC's Greenville campus at 1325 Yellow Jacket Drive.
4. **Nelnet payment plan** – MCC offers a convenient monthly budget plan through Nelnet Business Solutions to pay tuition and fees. Students wishing to enroll in the payment plan must be registered for classes and enroll in the plan by the end of drop period. Students may make payments by automatic bank withdrawal or by charging to a credit or debit card (MasterCard, Discover, American Express or Visa). A non-refundable \$25 fee is required to enroll in this plan. There is a \$30 returned payment fee if a payment is returned for non-sufficient funds. If a credit/debit card is used, a convenience fee, in addition to the enrollment fee, will be assessed. - 5. **Financial aid** - For students with completed financial aid files, aid will be applied to student accounts as Estimated Aid. If the award does not cover the balance in full, the student is responsible for paying the difference by the due date. If the student has applied for financial aid but the award does not appear on the account by the due date, the student must be prepared to pay the bill or enroll in the Nelnet payment plan in order to remain registered for classes.
- 6. **Employer or sponsoring agency** – An authorization must be on file with the MCC Business Office by the payment due date in order for MCC to invoice the authorizing agency. - 7. **Senior scholarship** – Scholarships are available to persons age 60 or older who reside within the college district and will be subject to requirements currently in effect.
