The RN-to-BSN (post-licensure completion) program is offered by The Herbert H. and Grace A. Dow College of Health Professions and designed for Registered Nurses (RNs) to obtain their Bachelors of Science in Nursing (BSN) Degree. The major is to educate the nursing student in theory and application of nursing concepts beyond those learned in their previous coursework and their current work experiences. The degree and major are built on a solid base in liberal education for professional nursing practice and knowledge. The program focuses on nursing leadership, global and population health, systems thinking, and evidence-based practice.

Admission Requirements, Retention & Termination Standards

To be considered for admission, a student must meet the following criteria:

- A completed program application
- An active, unencumbered RN license
 - **Note:** A student with an A.D.N. may apply to the program, receive provisional admission and take up to 12 credits while preparing for the NCLEX- RN examination.
- An admission GPA of 2.5 or higher

Application Submission Deadline: The University admits students into this program twice a year in the spring and fall semesters. Students may apply to the program at any time during the last semester of the Associate degree or diploma program or after completing the program.

Once admitted into the program, students must:

- Maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher.
- Maintain an active, unencumbered RN license in your state.

If a student does not continue to meet retention standards, s/he may be asked to withdraw from the program. The nursing faculty maintains the right to terminate a student from the program if s/he is not progressing satisfactorily.

Practical Experience: American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN) BSN essentials require all RN to BSN programs to include 'practice experience' into the program. This experiential learning strategies, or practice experience is incorporated into several courses throughout the program. You will be able to complete this experiential learning at your workplace or in your community. Students can identify their own practice experience with faculty approval.

General Notes

- A grade of C or better is required for a course to transfer.
- A bachelor's degree at CMU requires a minimum of 120 semester hours of credit. Some majors or degrees will require more.
 - A minimum of 30 semester hours of credit must be earned from CMU.
 - A minimum of 40 hours must be completed at the 300 level or above. **Upon successful completion of all requirements of the major, 10 of the 45 credit hours awarded for an active unencumbered RN license will be equivalent to the CMU 300 level.**
- The University Program Requirements and competencies, other than Writing Intensive competencies, may be fulfilled by students who satisfy the MTA
- **Students are required to meet the following CMU Competency Requirements with a "C" or above: two Written English (composition) courses, one Oral English (communication) course, one Mathematics course designated by CMU as a competency course, one Quantitative Reasoning Course, and 12 credits in Writing Intensive Coursework. Students who satisfy MTA are exempted from six credits of Writing Intensive coursework. The remaining six credits of Writing Intensive coursework must be completed at CMU.**

Any remaining required and elective courses for a bachelor's degree will be selected in consultation with an academic advisor to ensure that CMU degree requirements are being met.
